



IN THE MATTER of the Resource Management Act 1991 (the Act) of Notice of Motion under Section 87G requesting the granting of resource consents to WELLINGTON INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT LIMITED for the WELLINGTON INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT EXTENSION OF RUNWAY: CONSTRUCTION, OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE
(ENV-2016-WLG-000058)

**NINETEENTH MINUTE OF THE ENVIRONMENT COURT
(20 APRIL 2018)**

- 1) This minute records the matters discussed at the judicial conference on 18 April 2018 and directions now made.

- 2) Appearances were made by:
 - Ms A Dewar & Mr I Gordon for Wellington International Airport Limited (WIAL) (Ms Dewar also entered an appearance on behalf of Housing New Zealand);
 - Ms H Irwin-Easthope for Air New Zealand;
 - Mrs R Conner & Ms G Chappell for the Board of Airline Representatives New Zealand Inc;
 - Mr J Gardner-Hopkins for Guardians of the Bay Incorporated;
 - Mr N Kile for Jumpjet Holdings Ltd/ Jumpjet Airlines Ltd;
 - Mr G Kingston for Strathmore Park Progressive and Beautification Association.



3) WIAL advised that it consented to the waiver application made by Breaker Bay Moa Point Progressive Association Incorporated to join the proceedings as a s274 party. The waiver was granted accordingly.

4) The Court advises that it has determined to grant the deferment of these proceedings to 31 October 2018 as requested by WIAL upon the following conditions:

- WIAL is to advise the Court in writing within five working days of lodging its application for RESA approval (the application) with the Director General of Civil Aviation. If this is delayed beyond 30/4/18 a memorandum is to be filed in the Court advising the reason for the delay and the anticipated date of lodgement;
- Advice of lodgement is to be accompanied by a copy of the RESA application document lodged with the Director General. WIAL need not file supporting technical reports or the like with the Court provided the application document enables interested parties to understand the full nature and extent of the proposed runway extension, including the RESA;
- WIAL is to file monthly reports with the Court commencing 29 June 2018 advising as to progress with the application.

The Court formally records that in making these directions it does not seek to interfere with the process adopted by the Director General in any way nor the timing of that process.

5) If this matter is to proceed to hearing the Court will, pursuant to s279(1)(a) RMA, order the consent authorities to give public notice advising that:

- The application made by WIAL for resource consent to the extension of Wellington Airport runway which was publically notified on 2 July 2016 is to proceed to hearing;
- Plans of the proposed runway extension, including the RESA as now approved by the Director General of Civil Aviation, are available for viewing at the offices of the consent authorities;
- Any person who has not yet joined the proceedings but who wishes to do so may file a notice in the Environment Court pursuant to s274 RMA no




later than (date to be advised) and shall thereafter be a party to the proceedings.

The final form and proposed extent of the notice shall be submitted by the consent authorities to the Court for approval. For the purposes of s279(1)(b) RMA, the Court records that WIAL advised that it does not oppose the making of such an order.

6) The Court will convene a further judicial conference at a date which it determines after 31 October 2018 in order to review progress of the application and/or make further directions to progress these proceedings to hearing. The Court formally confirms the assurance which it gave to s274 parties that any directions which it makes will allow generous time for them to review the information to be advanced by WIAL in support of its proposal.

7) Any party may seek further directions by notice in writing at any time. Such notice to be directly served on counsel for WIAL but otherwise notice to the parties to be given through the Court's website.
